TWELVE OAKS VOLUNTEERS TO PARTICIPATE IN THE THE FLORIDA COASTAL CLEANUP

Saturday, September 17

Twelve Oaks volunteers and teens from the Town 'N Country Youth Council will put on their work gloves and old sneakers for the Florida Coastal Cleanup. This single-day volunteer effort focuses on protecting wildlife and waterways by collecting trash and debris from shorelines. Keep Hillsborough County Beautiful tries to help solve the problems of litter by sponsoring the Florida Coastal Cleanup. Communities with ponds and lakes throughout Florida are encouraged to participate in this annual event. "People are the problem, but people are also the solution." Removing debris, dead tree limbs, and invasive plants is one pollution problem that community volunteers can solve with action.



Saturday, September 17 from 8:30 A.M. until noon, volunteers will be working together to remove debris including tree limbs and dead or invasive plants from the shorelines of the lakes on Twelve Oaks Blvd. Debris can choke our lakes and ruin our view, as well as endanger the wildlife in the area.

Terry Raulerson, a Twelve Oaks volunteer, is site captain. Terry has made arrangements for **two dumpsters to be placed on Twelve Oaks Blvd. between the two lakes**. Volunteers are asked to meet at that location at 8:30 A.M. to pick up supplies and receive a special tee shirt identifying the event. Forms will be available for teens that need to earn community service hours for graduation or Honor Society. This location will make it easy for volunteers to dispose of the tree / shrub debris and garbage that is collected. - Items To Consider Selling: Toys and games, tools, yard equipment, clothing, seasonal items, crafts, fabric and craft supplies, furniture and wall décor, dishes, glassware, cookware, bicycles and bicycle parts, magazines and books, automotive parts, costume jewelry, and watches.
- Savers and Pack Rats: Sort through your garage, closets, attics, sheds, storage units, dresser drawers, bookcases, and any other place where "treasures" accumulate. Ask yourself if it's worth the space or the effort to dust and clean it on a regular basis.
- Crafters: Organize and create craft items you plan to sell. Seasonal and other homemade items are always popular.
- Food Vendors: Plan for and order food and beverage items you plan to sell. Please note that the sale of alcoholic beverages is prohibited.

TIPS FOR A SUCCESSFUL GARAGE SALE

- Clean and polish your wares.
- Gather display equipment: sturdy tables, racks, shelf units, hangars, boxes
- Display items neatly and group like items together (by style or price). Re-arrange as items sell.
- Hang clothing on hangars using clothing rack or rope for display.
- Collect newspapers and plastic bags for wrapping.
- Make signs and price tags, using masking tape or stickers. Price to sell but leave room for negotiation. Items may be marked down as the day goes on.
- Gather extension cords and batteries for testing electronics.
- Have a calculator, pen, and paper available.
- Have the change available to start your day

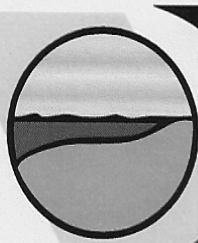

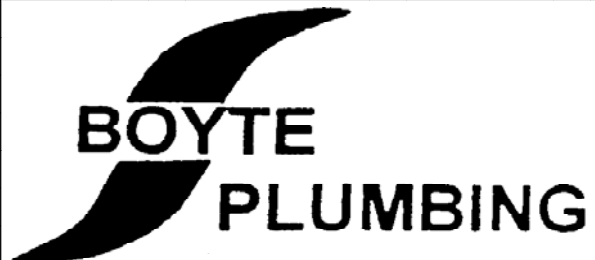

An adult book discussion on *The Last Time I Saw You* by Elizabeth Berg will take place on Wednesday, Sept. 21 at 3:00 P.M. Copies of the book are available at the library. The Friends of the Town 'N Country Regional Library Bargain Street Book Store is open at all times that the Library is open with books at bargain prices. The Hillsborough County Extension Service offers free plant clinics each month at the Town and Country Library. The programs are given by volunteer **Master Gardeners** that are trained by the University of Florida. All information is research-based by the University. This month's topic, Rain Barrels, will be offered on Thursday, September 8 at 6:30 P.M. A rain barrel, also known as an "urban cistern", is a convenient way to catch and store 55 gallons of rainwater to use for general outdoor purposes – watering your plants, washing your car, rinsing off gardening tools, etc. Participants will learn that rain barrels are a convenient and efficient way to collect water and how rain barrels provide a free source of chemical-free water to use for irrigating landscape. Attend this workshop and learn how to make your own rain barrel to help reduce the storm water runoff from your yard.

The Town 'N Country Senior Center is a leading facility for senior citizens to engage in an assortment of daily programming. The Center provides stimulating activities, health and wellness, educational programs, opportunities for socialization and nutritious meals in an enriched environment for active adults and senior citizens. The Center, located on the first floor of the Town 'N Country Library, is open from 8 A.M. to 4 P.M. Monday through Friday. (NOTE: The Center will be closed Monday, Sept. 5, Labor Day.) Jazzercise, Zumba, Line Dancing, Tai Chi, and exercise classes are offered. Seniors can learn about Medicare, how to manage prescriptions, and the importance of having blood pressure checks. All are part of the center's mission to focus on active adults and healthy living. On any given day, guests could be working out in classes or alone in the fitness center, scrap booking, watching movies, participating in crafts, or playing bridge, bingo, mahjongg, pinocle, and canasta.

Sheriff's Office Needs School Crossing Guards —The Hillsborough County Sheriff's Department is looking for qualified people to be school crossing guards for the 2010-11 school year. Guards are typically assigned intersections near their homes. Guards must be at least 19 years old and possess a valid driver's license or Florida identification card and a Social Security card. They must also pass a background check. Pay is \$10.38 an hour for 10 hours a week. The job entitles the participant to enroll in the Florida Retirement System. Uniforms, equipment, and training are provided by the Sheriff's Office. There are opportunities to advance to supervisory positions.
