#### HELLO, MAY! LET'S MAKE IT A SAFE ONE

#### CARRIAGE HOMES TO BENITO BOARDWALK ACCESS:

Many families are familiar with the boardwalk connecting the Carriage Homes to the back field of Benito Middle School. In the past, a gate at this location allowed students to walk to and from school with ease. However, we have recently received notice from Benito Middle School that this access point is no longer permitted.

Due to updated safety measures implemented by the Hillsborough County School Board, this entrance is now closed and will not be accessible moving forward. Please inform your children if they previously used this route.

#### COMMUNITY CENTER & POOL USE - SUMMER GUIDELINES:

With summer break approaching, we want to remind all residents of important guidelines for using Community Center facilities, especially the pools.

- PROOF OF RESIDENCY REQUIRED: All residents must present proof of residency —either an Access Control Card or a valid driver's license—when using Community Center facilities.
- SUPERVISION OF MINORS: Children under 14 must be accompanied and actively supervised by an adult resident (18+) at all times. Unaccompanied minors or individuals without proper identification will be asked to leave.
- GUEST POLICY: Each household may bring up to 4 guests to the community center pools, who must be accompanied by an adult resident (18+) at all times.
- POOL RULES TO REMEMBER:
  - · No running or horseplay on the pool decks
  - No food or beverages in the pools
  - No smoking or vaping
  - No large floats allowed (small personal floatation devices are permitted if they do not obstruct others)
  - No pets/animals permitted

Starting in June, Pool Attendants will be on duty through August to monitor activity, help enforce rules, and operate the popular Snack Shack. Their presence is here to support a safe, clean, and enjoyable environment for all.

#### PEDESTRIAN SAFETY REMINDER:

With the school year ending, there will be a noticeable increase in pedestrian activity throughout the community—particularly children and families. We urge all drivers to be extra cautious.

- Observe all posted speed limits
- Avoid distractions—PUT DOWN YOUR PHONE
- Be alert and drive responsibly, especially near residential streets and crosswalks

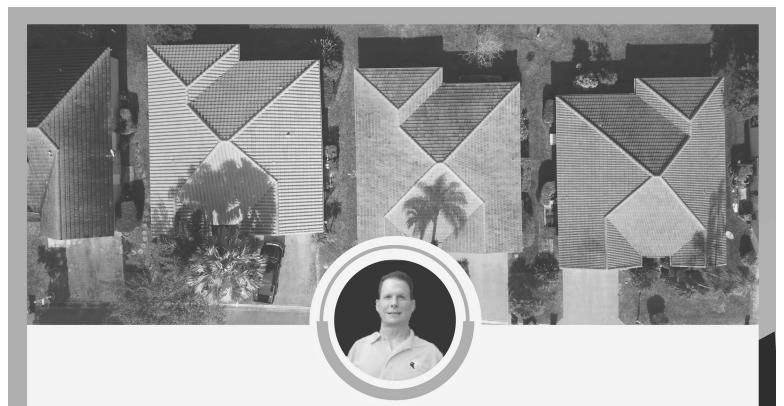

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#### ARBOR GREENE HOMEOWNERS ASSOCIATION: ESTOPPELS EXPLAINED

One of the AG HOA business procedures used to ensure new homeowners are aware of any HOA violations or outstanding assessments is the HOA estoppel

An estoppel certificate is required in Florida and is a document that details a property's HOA fees and responsibilities to a new homeowner. It's required before closing on a property and is used to protect buyers from hidden fees and violations.

#### WHY IS AN ESTOPPEL CERTIFICATE REQUIRED?

- It's a vital document that ensures transparency and accountability within our HOA. It's used to facilitate a closing.
- It ensures that all assessments are paid up.
- It ensures that assessment contributions are prorated between the buyer and seller.

#### WHAT'S INCLUDED IN AN ESTOPPEL CERTIFICATE?

- The current and outstanding assessments.
- Any violations or fines.
- Any rules or regulations that might affect the new owner. The status of any ongoing disputes or legal issues.
- The HOA's control over the purchase process.
- Contacts for the HOA.

The buyer requests the estoppel certificate from the HOA management company before closing. The HOAs authorized agent, Terra Management, must deliver the document within 5 business days.

Your HOA Board of Directors wants to keep you informed of our business processes and how we conduct business for you. The HOA estoppel process is used to inform new owners and to keep our community values high and home appearances excellent!

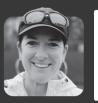

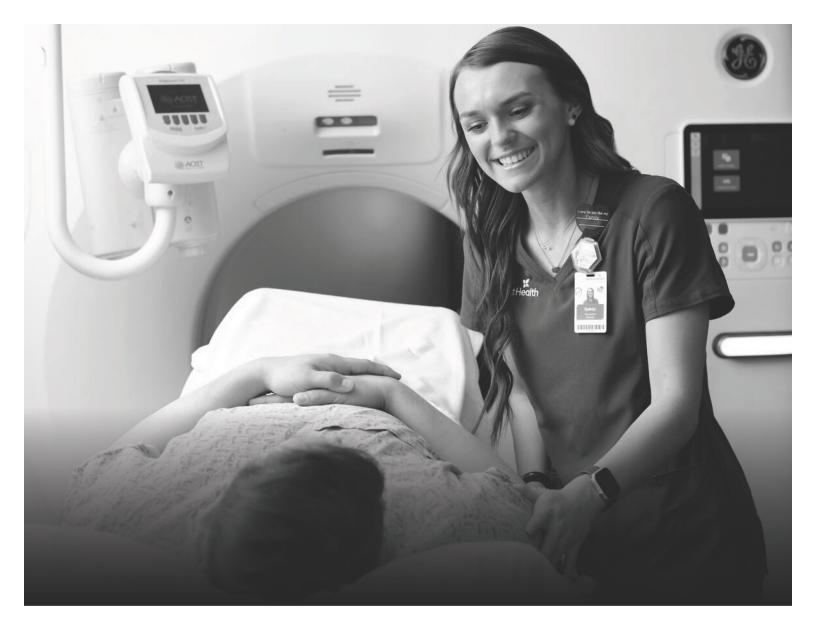
