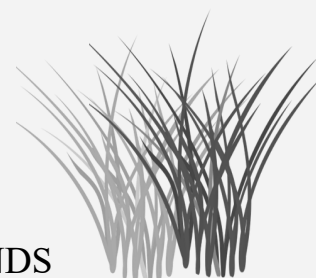

Community Association Updates

Controlled Access-

The Board and the Controlled Access Committee (CAC) have been reviewing community feedback regarding controlled access. The CAC will present its recommendations to the Board for discussion at the April BOD meeting to address residents' requests. Members are welcome to attend.

Drainage-

All drainage issues identified during the spring inspection have been resolved. The next inspection is scheduled for the fall. In the meantime, the Drainage Committee is preparing to launch the swale rehabilitation project on East Lake Woodlands Parkway between Hunter's Drive and Hunter's Place. This project will also include repairing the asphalt cart path and adding a pedestrian crosswalk across East Lake Woodlands Parkway.

Landscaping-

As we enter spring, the committee is set to begin several landscaping projects.

In the cleared area on Woodlands Drive and Nina Way, a contractor will soon cut down and treat the remaining pepper tree stumps to prevent regrowth. Additionally, the area will be seeded with grass, allowing it to grow alongside natural grasses to create a welcoming habitat for birds to feed and nest.

Woodlands Pkwy. entrance – sod replacement is scheduled for late March/early April for section within the medians at the SunTrust/Truist entrance.

ELWCA and Duke Energy are working with a contractor to have the storm debris removed from the property soon.

The committee continues to find ways to enhance the property.

Roads & Sidewalks-

Green Earth Pressure Washing has done a great job of pressure washing the sidewalks and curbs within the community. It has definitely made a difference.

The committee will be meeting with contractors in April/May to discuss the next areas of sidewalk that will need to be repaired or replaced.

Monument Signs at Tampa Rd. and East Lake Rd.-

All three monument signs and the knee wall at Woodlands Blvd. are scheduled for a refresh. The scope includes the removal of the flag stone, new stucco, paint, architectural enhancements and landscape lighting. The new look will be modern and clean.



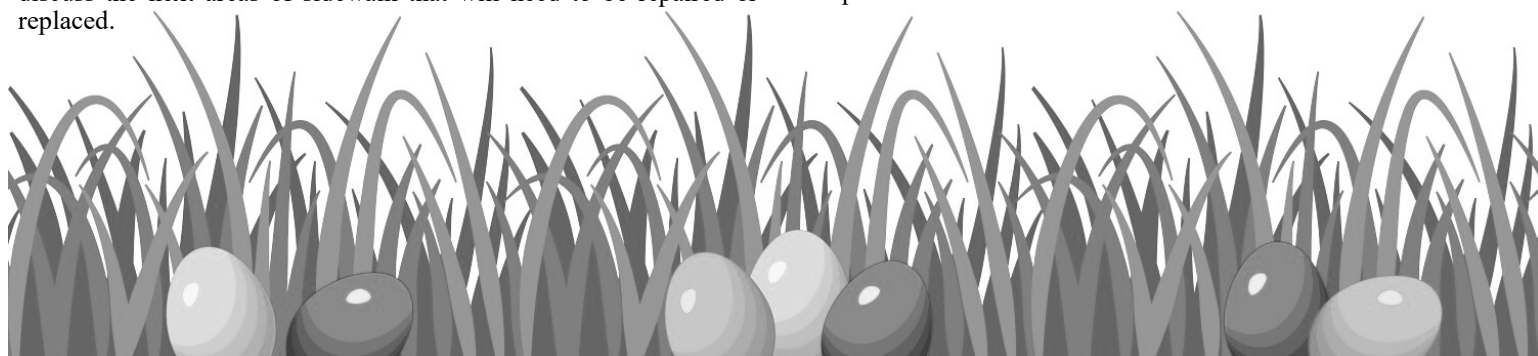

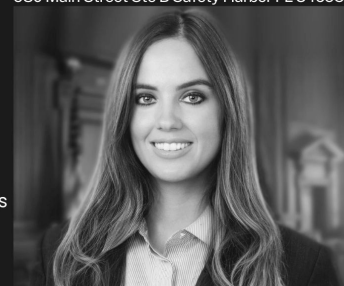

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What's Included in a Spring Clean Up

Spring is here and outdoor chores are in order:

- Service your mowers as they are about to work again regularly!
- Adjust your sprinkler times for the drier months expected through May
- Check your lawn and resod areas which were too weedy during the last growing season
- Prune easement trees 15ft above roadway grade (anything below 15ft will get damaged by Republic Services trucks, Fedex, UPS etc.). Prune shrubs and trees when new growth begins: The end of the dormant season is a good time to prune many trees and shrubs. Cold damaged shrubs can be pruned back to where new growth appears.
- Replace plantings affected by freezes.
- If you have azaleas in your landscape they need to be pruned after blooming
- Prune spring flowering trees and shrubs after blooming: Prune after the last flowers fade but before new buds set in mid to late summer
- Mulch conserves moisture during dry weather and minimizes weeds in landscape beds.
- The drier months are ideal for completing jobs like exterior home repainting.
- Clean Mailboxes and mail posts.

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Clear Air Turbulence

Airplanes are able to fly because of a delicate balance between two main forces. Gravity is the force pulling the plane down for the surface. Lift is the force that pushes the plane upward against the force of gravity.

Lift is generated by the airflow over the wings. The wings are shaped so that the airflow over the top of the wing is faster than the airflow below the bottom of the wing. The faster airflow over the top of the wing results in a lower air pressure on the top of the wing. As a result, the air pressure pushing upward on the bottom of the wing is now greater than the air pressure pushing downward on the top of the wing. This results in a net force acting upward that we call lift, and this is why a plane is able to fly.

When a plane enters a region of turbulence (typically caused by eddies), wind shear, updraft or downdraft, or if a layer of ice forms on the wings, the smooth airflow over the wings becomes interrupted and the amount of lift being generated may decrease. This will cause the airplane to lose altitude - often dramatically - until the pilot can correct this situation or the entire plane moves out of the turbulent region. If the plane is at a cruising altitude

this will usually just result in an exciting ride for a very short period of time, and this is one reason why airlines tell passengers to keep their seat belts on while they are seated.

If the airplane runs into this type of turbulence near the ground, such as during takeoff or landing, the situation may be much more severe because the pilot may have very little time to correct the situation before the plane hits the ground. All major airports now have sophisticated Doppler radars installed to detect these dangerous conditions of wind shear near the ground.

Atmospheric turbulence affecting aircraft sometimes occurs when the aircraft is crossing a frontal boundary or when entering or leaving a jet stream. The phenomenon is referred to as clear air turbulence because it usually occurs in clear air with blue skies and therefore little warning to pilots. The most reliable method for pilots to learn about regions where turbulence exists is from reports from other pilots to air traffic controllers or directly to other pilots who are in the air. Air traffic controllers can relay this information to flights in the vicinity.

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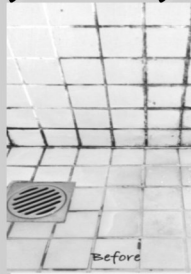
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Chef Warren Presents: Middle Eastern Cuisine

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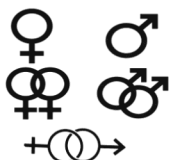

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East Lake Fire Rescue Offers Essential Tips for Wildfire Safety and Prevention

As Florida enters peak wildfire season, East Lake Fire Rescue reminds residents to take proactive steps to protect their homes and communities. Wildfires can spread rapidly, especially during dry and windy conditions, making preparedness crucial.

Preventing Wildfires

Most wildfires are caused by human activity, meaning prevention is key. Follow these safety tips to reduce the risk:

- Be mindful with outdoor recreational fires. Always check local regulations and never leave a fire unattended.
- Properly dispose of cigarettes: Never discard smoking materials on the ground or out of a car window.
- Use equipment safely: Sparks from lawnmowers, chainsaws, and vehicles can ignite dry vegetation. Keep equipment maintained and avoid using it during extreme heat or wind.
- Create defensible space: Keep a 30-foot safety zone around your home by clearing dry leaves, pine needles, and dead vegetation.

Protecting Your Home

Taking a few simple precautions can help safeguard your home against wildfire:

- Trim trees and shrubs: Maintain a safe distance between branches and your home, and remove dead or overhanging limbs.
- Use fire-resistant materials: Consider non-combustible roofing, siding, and fencing to reduce fire spread.
- Keep gutters clean: Remove dry debris that could ignite from flying embers.

- Ensure accessibility: Clearly mark your address, and maintain wide, clear driveways for emergency vehicles.

Homeowners Associations

- Maintain fire department access: Ensure all access roads maintain a minimum vertical clearance of 13 feet 6 inches and a minimum of 20 feet clear width. This is necessary to allow emergency vehicles, especially fire trucks, to pass through without obstruction by trimming trees and removing any obstructions.
- Address numbers: Shall be 12-inch numbers on all multi-family and commercial buildings with a contrasting background.
- Fire hydrant clearance: Provide a clear space of at least 5 feet in front and 3 feet behind and to the sides.
- Ensure accessibility: Ensure all gates are maintained in good working condition and provide fire department access.

Be Ready to Evacuate

In the event of a wildfire, having a plan can save lives:

- Prepare an emergency kit: Include essential supplies such as food, water, medications, important documents, and a change of clothes.
- Have multiple evacuation routes: Know more than one way out of your neighborhood in case roads are blocked.
- Sign up for alerts: Stay informed through local emergency notifications and follow official evacuation orders.

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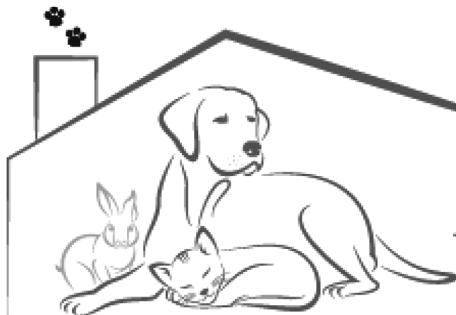

Hurricanes Helene and Milton

Overview of Allocation

The U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) directly awarded Pinellas County funding to support long-term recovery efforts following Hurricanes Helene and Milton. **These funds are designated to primarily benefit low- and moderate-income households and communities.** Each CDBG-DR activity must address a disaster-related impact (direct or indirect), be a CDBG eligible activity, and meet a CDBG national objective.

\$813,783,000

Total Pinellas County CDBG-DR Direct Allocation

CDBG-DR funding supports disaster relief, long-term recovery, restoration of infrastructure and housing, economic revitalization and mitigation in the most impacted and distressed areas, according to HUD. These funds are designated to primarily benefit low- and moderate-income households and communities. No program allocations have been made at this time. Pinellas County will announce opportunities for public input on developing an action plan for these funds in the near future. Identifying how to best use the funds and starting programs to distribute them is expected to take

Swallow Tailed Kites • *Barbara Walker*

Swallow-tailed kites used to nest in 21 states and are now down to 7. Florida carries the population of this species in the United States. They are not considered endangered, but they are a species of greatest conservation need, particularly due to their diverse diet and their long migration. They arrive on their natal territories in early March. Seen often in 3's, they drift effortlessly through the air, using their tail as a rudder. Females will perch early in the morning to preen, and males deliver lizards for breakfast. The third bird is often seen with them and acts as a helper or back up during nesting season. Found in some of the tallest trees, their nests sway in the air at around 110 feet. Usually, they are located within cypress domes. Their favorite tree is the loblolly pine. Sturdier slash pines are sometimes used as well, a choice that bodes well for the nest during our windier season. Incubation starts in early April. By June, the kids have fledged if the nest has not failed due to weather or owls. Parents teach the young the hunting route. They are incredibly social birds and are known to check on their neighbors as well. Where there is one kite nest, there are likely more kite nests. They are known to take baby birds, snakes, lizards, baby turkeys, bats, rodents, dragonflies, frogs, wasps and many other insects. Uniquely, for a species that migrates to South America, after the young have learned the territory, they often head north towards agricultural areas to fatten up on insects. Hundreds of kites will gather where rich food supplies exist. Swallow-tailed kites have the spongiest stomachs of all raptors because they eat so many stinging insects. This makes them beneficial to our crops. Once they reach their desired weight, they gather in groups by the hundreds at various areas throughout the state as they stage for migration. Late summer they begin to cross the Gulf of America/Mexico towards the Yucatan Peninsula. They go deep into South American and intermingle with a non-migratory group of swallow-tailed kites. Fires in the Amazon benefit the kites as they are known to skirt the edges of the fires to catch escaping prey. They then turn around and sail back. Many kites are seen in East Lake as they nest throughout the preserve and Pinellas County. Join Tampa Bay Raptor Rescue on April 5th, 10:30am, at Brooker Creek Preserve to meet Sunshine and Tory, two beautiful Swallow-tailed Kites that live at Moccasin Lake Nature Park. The program is sponsored by Friends of Brooker Creek Preserve.

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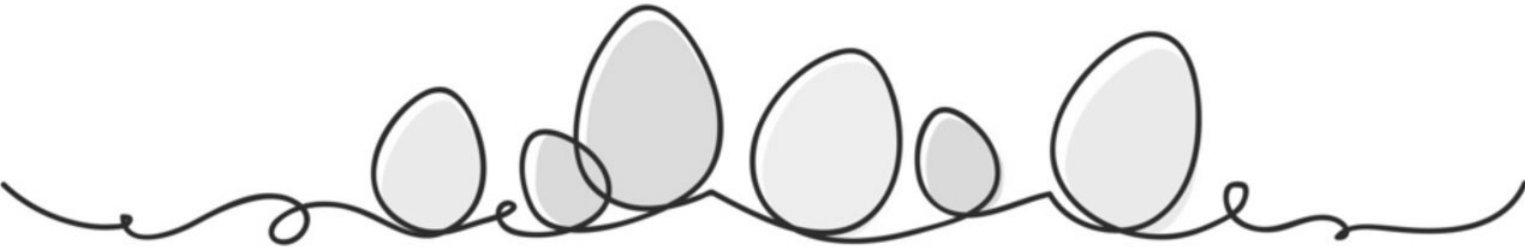
