Hello Heritage Isles. Happy Spring!!!

The Board would like to take this opportunity to bring the community up to speed on an important change to the parking regulations that were unanimously adopted during the board meeting held March 24th.

The current parking rules were put into place November 2020. Since then, there has been a significant improvement regarding keeping our streets clear for emergency vehicles, but we still have a need for improvement. What follows below are the new regulations which the Board felt were more reasonable and therefore easier to comply with.

Please note the following changes to the parking rules:

- No overnight street parking from 12 AM to 9 AM
- Residents/visitors/vendors are allowed to park street side for 4 hours
- Odd day/even day rules still apply.

The main issue would appear to be that hosts are not informing guests about the Odd/Even parking rule. We must help our guests understand that our streets must always be passable for emergency vehicles. Once again, if it's an odd

calendar day the parking is on the side of the street with an odd number address, and vice versa. At the very least make sure an emergency vehicle can pass without an issue. AT NO TIME SHOULD ANY VEHICLES BE PARKED ACROSS FROM EACH OTHER. Please use common sense and situational awareness. FYI, the complete parking document is available to read on our website — Heritageisleshoatampa.com as well as the Condominium Associates resident portal.

Remember the community speed limit is 25 MPH.

Now on to homeowner maintenance. Last year over 160 lawns were identified as deficient bv management company. Healthy green, weed-free lawns are the first sign of prideful ownership. Let's everyone's lawn look great this season. Water use is now one day per week so that obviously means watering for a longer period. The board realizes that our 'beloved' oak trees create an additional set of issues so there may be a need to apply additional water and fertilizer. Residents have had great success with using Milorganite, especially under the trees. If you do nothing, at best you will get weeds, at worst, you will get barren dirt.

# Home Tip of the Month Is your ceiling fan spinning the right way?

As the Florida heat kicks in, here's a quick way to make your home feel cooler: make sure your ceiling fan is spinning counterclockwise. This helps push cool air downward, creating a wind-chill effect that can make a room feel up to 4 degrees cooler—helping you stay comfortable and save on your energy bill.

You can usually change the direction using a small switch on the fan or with your remote control. A small adjustment that makes a big difference!

#### Did You Know?

You can install clear hurricane window film without DRB approval—as long as it's professionally done?

Hurricane season runs from June 1 to November 30, and now is the time to make sure your home is storm-ready. According to Nassau Pointe's community standards, clear, professionally installed window film is allowed without prior approval from the Design Review Board. Just remember:

- The film must be completely clear
- It must be professionally installed

This is a simple way to add protection without making structural changes. For any other exterior modifications, be sure to submit a request for approval first.

#### I've Lost My Pet! What Do I Do?

Losing a pet can be overwhelming. The key to finding your beloved companion is to remain steadfast in your search. Here are a few tips to help you in your search.

- Ensure their microchip contact information is current. You may need to update your address and/or telephone number.
- Check with your local animal shelters. Visit in person as well as conduct an online search of their animals. DAILY.
- Use social media You will see that

Facebook offers local "Lost and Found" (https://www.facebook.com/Lostandfoundpetsofhillsboroughcounty) pages to help. Also, search PetHarbor (http://www.petharbor.com) and Craigslist (http://tampa.craigslist.org/laf/).

- Place posters around the entire neighborhood (including stores, parks, vet
  offices, groomers, etc.) fliers should have a clear picture of your pet.
- Place a large sign in your yard.
- Offer a reward.
- Perform physical, door-to-door searches, hand out fliers. Word of mouth often helps in recovery.
- Advertise in local newspapers.
- Contact local veterinarian offices to alert them in case someone contacts them.
- Don't give up.



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
