POOL RULES

The use of the pool is for residents only. You are allowed to bring 5 guests per household. If you have guests, and are unable to accompany them, a guest pass may be obtained at the clubhouse.

- 1. YOU MUST be 18 years old to bring guest(s) to the pool or gym.
- 2. You must be 16 years old to use the fitness room.
- Playground use is for 12 years old or younger. Children under 5 must be accompanied by an adult.
- 4. You are allowed to use the pool without an adult at 14 years old.
- 5. The Splash Pad is for 7 years old or younger. All children must be accompanied by an adult.
- 6. Swim diapers are required.
- 7. NO GLASS, SMOKING OR VAPE PERMITTED. USE OF ALCOHOL IS NOT PERMITTED.
- 8. When lightning is detected, you MUST leave the pool and pool deck. It's for your safety.

Upon request, Gate will be open on the 1st Sunday of the month Gates will be open from 12:00 noon to 4pm All signage must be removed by 5pm day of open house. Please call clubhouse by the Friday before to have this set up.

As the swim season approaches, and you come to spend time at the pool, you will notice the new pool tables and chairs on the pool deck that will be arriving soon. This was an expensive expenditure. I ask that you do not put any tape or anything sticky. Please do not use tables as a changing table. There are changing tables in both restrooms.

At the end of last year, we had the fence around the pool deck and playground refinished. The company did a fantastic job. It looks brand new. Again, I'm asking for no tape to be put on the fence. You can use string, ribbon, or anything similar.

I have placed an order for new playground spring equipment. As you might have seen,

what is there is extremely rusted. We have put caution tape on the two (2) pieces for your safety. What is on order is a Pony Spring rider and a two (2) person Teeter. The staff has noticed more children sitting on the very top outside of the brown slide. Please remind your children that it is very dangerous and not acceptable.

The sidewalks on Oakstead Bvld, Lake Patience, Tuckerman, and Manasses have been powered washed as well as all the entrances to each village. This has been long overdue. Even though these streets are county roads, the Oakstead residents take pride in the community. It's unfortunate our grounds are used as a trash can. I have to say, I have seen many of the residents while on their walk pick up the trash on the Blvd. It does show the pride we have in our community. Thank you!

May 30th is the last day of school. There will be more kid traffic in the community. Please watch for our young adults riding their bikes, scooters, skateboards, and whatever mode of transportation they're using. The Oakstead Staff want to wish all the Oakstead residents a safe, happy, and healthy summer. We look forward to all coming to the pool.



Note from Board Supervisor by Norm Keith



As you read this Memorial Day is May 26 and I felt it would be appropriate to dwell on it because it is a very special day in our great country. I will present some background information pertaining to the history and spe-

cial facts about this day of remembrance. I am also including a poem which I feel expresses the heart felt sentiment of Memorial Day.

In traditional observance, the flag of the United States is raised briskly to the top of the staff and then solemnly lowered to the half-staff position, where it remains only until noon. It is then raised to full-staff for the remainder of the day. The half-staff position remembers the more than one million men and women who gave their lives in service of their country. At noon, their memory is raised by the living, who resolve not to let their sacrifice be in vain, but to rise up in their stead and continue the fight for liberty and justice for all.

Other traditional observances included wearing red poppies, visiting cemeteries and placing flags or flowers on the graves of our fallen heroes, and visiting memorials.

Traditional observance of Memorial Day has diminished over the years and many Americans have forgotten the meaning and traditions of the day. At many cemeteries, the graves of the fallen are increasingly ignored or neglected. Most people no longer remember the proper flag etiquette for the day. While there are towns and cities that still hold Memorial Day parades, many have not held a parade in decades.

To help re-educate and remind Americans of the true meaning of Memorial Day, the "National Moment of Remembrance" resolution was passed in December 2000. It asks that at 3 p.m. local time all Americans "voluntarily and informally observe in their own way a Moment of Remembrance and respect, pausing from whatever they are doing for a moment of silence or listening to Taps."

A National Moment of Remembrance on Memorial Day

That poem about where "poppies blow" And, "the crosses, row on row" Still rings true, these ninety years After written, still brings tears.

We still have Dead, "amid the guns" And lose our young and our loved ones Those who lived, "short days ago" Who, "felt dawn, saw sunset glow".

In Flanders Fields, "the poppy red" Still grow near where the blood was bled They, "Take up our quarrel with the foe" And still die for Freedoms that we know. They pass, "The torch" to, "hold it high" And not, "break the faith with us who die" For they, "shall not sleep, though poppies grow" A National Moment of Beneath all those, "crosses, row on row" In Flanders Fields.

GUIDELINES

Tennis Court:

- 1. You must be a resident.
- 2. Courts are locked. The key can be signed out in the clubhouse.
- 3. We ask that you relock the gate when leaving.
- 4. No food or drinks are allowed except for water in non-breakable containers.
- 5. No loud music. Please refrain from using explicit language. Be respectful.
- 6. Proper attire is required. Shirts and tennis shoes with non-marking soles.
- 7. Children under the age of 16 must be accompanied by an adult.
- 8. No bicycles, roller blades, motorized moped or skateboards.
- 9. No Pets allowed.

Pool: Hours 10 am to Dusk (5 Guests Limit per Household)

- 1. No food or beverages in or around the pool. All coolers will be checked.
- No glass or smoking on the pool deck. (including vaping). No animals. No alcoholic beverages are permitted.
- 3. Shower before entering the pool.
- 4. No running, diving, or horseplay
- 5. Clean up your area including sweeping deck. Throw away all your garbage.

- Do not use tables as a diaper changing table. Changing tables available in the restrooms.
- 7. You must be 14 years old. Under 14 years old, you must be accompanied by an adult 18 years old. You must be 18 years old to bring guest(s).
- 8. BBQ grills are on a first come basis. Please limit your time so all have an opportunity to use grills. Please clean grills after use.
- 9. Splash Pad is for 7 years old and under. All children MUST be accompanied by an adult in the splash pad area. No Chairs allowed in the splash pad water.
- 10. When lightning is detected, you MUST leave the pool and pool deck.
- 11. Footwear is highly recommended due to the hot deck.
- 12. Chairs must be 6 ft or more from pool edge.
- 13. No loud music. Please refrain from using explicit language. Be respectful.
- 14. Oversized floats are not allowed. No hard balls allowed. Please use pool-approved water equipment.
- 15. When entering the clubhouse from pool deck, please use a towel.

Playground:

1. Children 12 and under Only

- Children under 5 MUST be accompanied by an adult 18 years old or older
- 3. No pets
- 4. No Glass, No Smoking (including vaping)
- 5. Throw away all your garbage.
- 6. Do Not go on top of slide. It is not safe.
- 7. Do Not throw mulch or bring it to the pool.

Gym:

- 1. You must be 16 years old
- 2. You must be 18 years old to bring guest (s)
- Proper attire is required. No dress shoes, sandals, boots, slippers, opentoed shoes, or bare feet.
- 4. Respect personal space
- 5. Clean up after yourself
- 6. Don't drop weights. Put your weight back
- 7. Wipe down equipment after use
- 8. Use headphones. Avoid using cell phones
- 9. No food or drinks allowed except for water in non-breakable containers
- 10. Please refrain from using explicit language
