POOL RULES

The use of the pool is for residents only. You are allowed to bring 5 guests per household. If you have guests, and are unable to accompany them, a guest pass may be obtained at the clubhouse.

1. YOU MUST be 18 years old to bring guest(s) to the pool or gym.
2. You must be 16 years old to use the fitness room.
3. Playground use is for 12 years old or younger. Children under 5 must be accompanied by an adult.
4. You are allowed to use the pool without an adult at 14 years old.
5. The Splash Pad is for 7 years old or younger. All children must be accompanied by an adult.
6. Swim diapers are required.
7. NO GLASS, SMOKING OR VAPE PERMITTED. USE OF ALCOHOL IS NOT PERMITTED.
8. When lightning is detected, you MUST leave the pool and pool deck. It's for your safety.

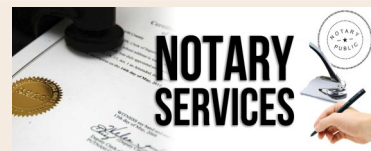

The answer is the HOA is not going to replace anything until we get constant daily rain so that new plantings will survive and thrive.

From time to time, I include an article about not feeding wildlife. Why? When seeds are put in the bird feeders, the birds will come and eat the seeds. Most of the seeds fall to the ground drawing rodents (mice, rats, squirrels, etc.) and then the armadillos and raccoons join the party. Once these critters discover there is a constant food source, they look for a place to live nearby. They find cozy living conditions by eating holes in the side of homes to have their young. What happens next is that the electrical wiring gets chewed up as well as other structural damage. So, please do not feed the animals.

August Community Update

Design Review Board (DRB) Reminder

Planning an exterior improvement? Please remember to obtain DRB approval before beginning any project that requires approval. This helps ensure compliance with our governing documents and community standards.

Exciting Update: Updating Pre-Approved Paint Color Program

The HOA is currently working with a Sherwin-Williams paint representative to develop updated pre-approved exterior paint color schemes for the Oakstead villages. Once completed, these color palettes will be available through the Sherwin-Williams app, making it easier for homeowners to select approved colors and helping streamline the DRB approval process.

We look forward to sharing more details as this program becomes available.

Tree Maintenance Update

There has been a misconception that the HOA

and CDD are planning to remove every tree throughout the community. We would like to clarify that this is not the case.

Tree removals are limited to those that have been identified as causing, or having the potential to cause, damage to community infrastructure such as sidewalks, roadways, drainage systems, and utilities. The goal is to protect community assets while preserving the natural beauty and tree canopy that make Oakstead a desirable place to live.

In addition, the HOA has begun sending violation notices regarding tree canopies over roadways at the direction of the Pasco County Fire Marshal's Office. The Fire Marshal has requested that tree canopies be maintained with a minimum clearance of 15 feet above all roadways. Low-hanging branches can interfere with fire engines and other emergency vehicles, potentially causing equipment damage and delaying emergency response. Maintaining this clearance helps ensure that first responders can safely and quickly access every home in the community when needed.

The HOA and CDD remain committed to preserving Oakstead's beautiful tree canopy while also protecting community infrastructure and

ensuring safe access for emergency services.

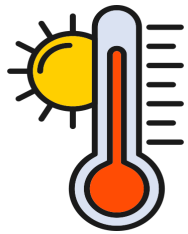

Weymouth HOA by Ryan Fisher



We hope you are staying safe and keeping cool during these intense summer months. As we navigate the peak of the August heat, the Board of Directors wants to provide an important update regarding the ongoing sod and lawn issues throughout our community. We know how much pride you take in our neighborhood's appearance, and we want to assure you that these landscape challenges are being actively investigated and addressed.

While it is true that we are currently experiencing a drought—which has naturally placed stress on our lawns and contributed to some of the brown spots—our landscaping team has identified a more specific culprit. The primary driver behind the severe sod damage in Weymouth is a widespread infestation of chinch bugs. These tiny pests thrive in hot, dry weather and actively destroy grass by sucking the moisture out of the blades.

Please rest assured that the Board is taking immediate, aggressive action to eliminate these pests. Our first and most critical step is to completely eradicate the chinch bugs and ensure they are no longer infesting portions of our grass. Once we are fully confident that the infestation is completely resolved, we will immediately begin evaluating the damaged areas and taking necessary steps to replace the ruined sod.

We want to extend a massive thank you to all the residents who are actively involved in the community and working hard through this brutal summer heat to maintain the beauty of their properties. While Weymouth is an HOA-maintained neighborhood where the association manages the irrigation, lawns, exterior painting, and roofs, it is important to remember that these are not maintenance-free homes. Homeowners are still responsible for various exterior upkeep tasks to protect and preserve their property values, and we deeply appreciate the residents who consistently take that initiative.

Back to School PENCIL COOKIES

These Pencil Cookies for Back to School are an easy no-bake treat made from sugar wafer cookies, candy melts, and mini chocolate chips. Fun, festive, and kid-friendly, they're great for school parties, or after-school snacks!

Prep Time: 20 minutes mins

Servings: 20 cookies

Ingredients

- 20 vanilla sugar wafer cookies
- 1/2 cup pink candy melts
- 1/2 cup white candy melts
- 20 mini chocolate chips
- 1 teaspoon vegetable oil or coconut oil (optional)

Equipment

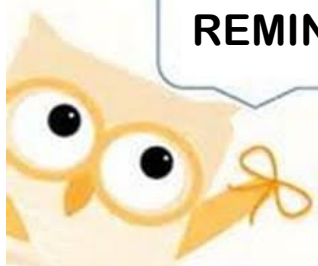
- 1 Stahl 3.5-inch Pairing Knife – German steel Great for cutting cookies
- 1 Bamboo Cutting Board for Kitchen
- 4 LE TAUCI Ramekins 4 OZ Oven Safe, Microwave safe Ramekins – Set of 4
- 1 Ceramic Half Baking Sheet Pan, Thicker Carbon Steel, Non Stick, 17.5 x 13 Inch

Instructions

- Line a baking sheet with parchment paper. Set aside. Trim one end of each wafer into a point.
- Melt pink candy melts in the microwave in 30-second intervals until smooth. If it seems too thick, stir in 1/2 teaspoon vegetable oil. Dip flat ends of cookies about 1/2 inch to create erasers. Place on parchment to set.
- Melt white candy melts. Add oil, if needed. Dip pointed ends of cookies about 1/2 inch. Immediately press a mini chocolate chip onto each tip. Place on parchment to set.
- Let set at room temperature or chill briefly in the refrigerator before serving. Store cookies in an airtight container at room temperature for up to 5 days.
