Construction has finally begun on the Pool Project. The old pool is now history, there is just dirt where it once was and the Veranda is down to the foundation. It will be exciting to watch as the new pool and structures begin to take shape.

We are also pleased

to be able to announce that we have negotiated a special rate for our homeowners to access the Apex center for \$5/day/person. You must be a homeowner and present a valid ID card to get this rate.

The extensive damage to the Association office is continuing to consume a lot of time as we work through the cleanup efforts and insurance adjustors. It will be several months before we will be able to move back into that location. In the interim, we have relocated our offices to 7290 Virginia Pkwy, Suite 2400 on the second floor. It is located above the McKinney Dance Studio in the three-story building in the same plaza as the Post Office. We are in full operation there now and the staff is all in that building.

This month's issue of the Magazine includes articles about Beach Club Project construction, pool season reminders, Compliance Department pointers on yardwork equipment, and an update from our GM.

Board Meeting, April 23, 2026

The Board meeting was called to order at 12:31 PM by President Dell'Antonia. Six Board members were present, Director Buerkle did not attend. Also attending were RealManage Vice President of On-site Management, our General Manager, Vice President of Accounting for RealManage and the Association's Attorney.

Homeowners Open Forum

Three homeowners attended, one to discuss Board meeting times and the other two for observation.

Consent Agenda

Approved the March 26, 2026 BOD meeting minutes.

Association Reports

Our VP of Finance of RealManage reviewed the March Financial

Reports including Balance sheet, Operating Statement, Investment schedule, Receivables aging report, Special assessment fund status, and Reserve and Capitol Funds allocations.

New Business

Project reports were presented on various landscape and grounds projects. Our Director of Maintenance updated us on the progress of repairing Wellington Point pond #7. It has proven to be a difficult repair. He also reported the Aquatic center pool is ready for the pool season to begin the first weekend of May. Director Edgar reported our groundbreaking ceremony for the pool project was scheduled for April 28, 2026 and did take place on that date.

Executive Session

We reviewed and approved the Collection Accounts Status Report and Foreclosures Report. We authorized moving forward with several collection related legal actions.

We approved funding requests for \$13,500 related to erosion behind the tennis courts and \$8,495 for the addition of a sidewalk extension at the Aquatic center. We also approved extension of the lap swim program through the month of September for the hours of 6:00 AM to-8:00 AM.

We also agreed to discontinue use of social media in favor of using our Website and resident portal for external communications.

We received an update from our General Manager on the remediation efforts and insurance claim discussions regarding our old office. There was extensive damage and the project is turning out to be quite complex.

We also received an update on our Reserve Study reset. The Reserve Study document is undergoing a complete overhaul of the way items are categorized to make it easier to read.

Board members reviewed activities with their respective Committees.

The Association's attorney updated the Board on current legal matters.

The meeting adjourned at 5:00 PM.

Coffee & Connect – Resident Engagement Initiative

We recently hosted another Coffee & Connect gathering with residents and members of the on-site team. Residents stopped by to meet with management, share feedback, ask questions, and discuss their experiences living in Stonebridge Ranch.

Coffee & Connect is a newer initiative we have introduced this year as part of our broader effort to strengthen communication and engagement opportunities within the community with the management team. This type of informal resident engagement model is commonly utilized in many large-scale associations and master-planned communities as a way to create open dialogue between homeowners and the teams working behind the scenes supporting day-to-day operations.

While emails, calls, and formal meetings remain important, these smaller in-person touchpoints help foster stronger relationships, transparency, and communication within the community. We appreciate all residents who attended and look forward to continuing the program moving forward.

Main Office Flood / Reconstruction Update

It has now been approximately 2.5 months since the January 28th fire suppression system flood impacting the Association office.

Management continues actively coordinating with insurance representatives, consultants, remediation professionals, and construction resources as we move into the next phase of the project, which is focused on finalizing reconstruction scope, build-back estimates, and overall project planning. This remains an active and evolving process as additional project coordination and scope reconciliation continues.

We appreciate the community's patience as we work through this complex restoration effort responsibly and methodically.

Beach Club Construction Safety Reminder

As excitement continues building around the Beach Club project, management would like to remind residents that the Beach Club and surrounding main office area remains an active construction zone.

We have recently observed residents and onlookers entering or approaching areas surrounding the project site. While we completely understand the excitement and enthusiasm surrounding the progress being made, we respectfully ask all residents to refrain from visiting the active construction area for safety reasons.

Construction sites present active hazards, equipment movement, restricted access areas, and ongoing contractor operations. For everyone's safety, please avoid entering or approaching the project area.

We appreciate everyone's continued excitement and support as this major community project continues progressing.

Gardening By The Moon

Conserving A Precious Natural Resource

Water use is very important to all of us. Conserving our natural resources has to be a priority for homeowners and communities. In the Texas metroplex and surrounding areas, the population is expected to grow by up to 4 million over the next 25 years. In light of this information, the demand and cost for water will only increase. Water conservation is now on the minds of state officials, water districts, community leaders, and homeowners.

Homeowners can take proactive steps right now to protect our water supply and promote sustainability. Start implementing these practices today to make a real difference.

Install smart irrigation controllers – Upgrade to a Wi-Fi-enabled system to significantly reduce water waste in your landscape. These controllers automatically adjust watering based on real-time weather, seasonal changes, and your yard’s needs— substantially reducing overwatering and unnecessary irrigation.

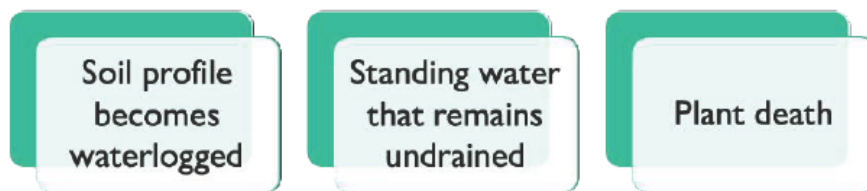
A major advantage of smart systems is their ability to keep your landscape in compliance with local watering restrictions and drought protocols. You can program city rules, seasonal limits, and drought stages directly into your controller app, so your system automatically adapts as regulations change - no manual adjustments required. Plus, automatic schedule optimization reduces watering during cooler months or after rain, saving you even more. Smart controllers are affordable and easy to install.

Plant Native and Drought-Tolerant Species – Incorporate drought-tolerant plants that are adapted to your local climate. These plants require less water to thrive, helping to reduce your overall water usage.

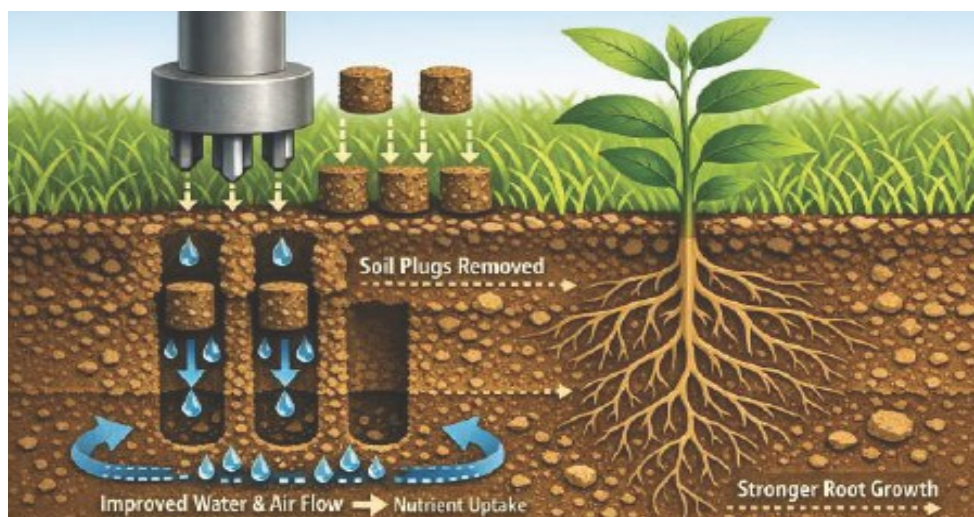
Irrigation Controllers from September through May – You can typically turn off your irrigation controllers from September through May unless there's a drought. If a drought occurs, run your system until rainfall patterns return to normal. In North Texas, normal rainfall will usually keep your landscape healthy during these months. If severe freezing weather is forecasted, run your irrigation before the freeze, then turn it off so it doesn't operate during the freeze. If it rained in the previous week, additional watering isn't needed.

In our experience, more plants die from overwatering rather than from underwatering.

Know your soils – Soils in the Stonebridge Ranch area are clay. Clay holds water very effectively for plants. In fact, many plants are overwatered in clay soils. When homeowners or even some landscape professionals see cracked soil, they assume plants need water. However, more plants are killed by overwatering. Overwatering and underwatering both cause wilting, so that is not a good indication to add more water. Feel the soil, or use a water meter, to a depth of 6 inches to determine whether the soil has adequate moisture for plants to thrive.



Agronomics is important - Aerating your turf is extremely important; do it at least once a year, and more often if your soil is compacted. Clay soils can be easily compacted by foot traffic, kids playing, and your pets. Aeration opens the soil so water can infiltrate and not run off down the street or into your neighbor’s yard.



Increase soil organic matter by top dressing with a high-organic blend of materials. Organic matter increases water-holding capacity and helps keep soils open for more water infiltration and deeper root development.

Fertilize with a slow-release fertilizer that increases root depth and plant or turf vigor. Deep roots help plants survive during drought. To find a slow-release fertilizer, look for words on the bag such as nitroform, ureaform, nutralene, or organic. Apply a fertilizer ratio such as 20-5-10, 20-5-5, 16-4-8, 16-4-4, 7-1-2, 7-1-1 or a similar ratio. If you apply a quick-release fertilizer, you will get a quick green up, but shallow roots that cannot tolerate drought. Fertilize three times per year: spring, summer, and fall.

Keep turf and beds weed-free – Weeds compete with your plants for water. Use a pre-emergent in March, May, and September for best control. Products like Halts and Preen make it easy for homeowners to manage weeds themselves.

Research Xeriscaping – When landscaping, use xeriscape principles that are approved by your community. In general, these may include reducing the amount of turf, increasing the use of mulch to a depth of 2 to 2 ½ inches, using rock and gravel, using drought-tolerant plant materials, and spacing of plant materials based on their mature size.

Stonebridge Ranch Guidelines for Landscaping

- Open Area Design: Front and side yards, forward of return fences, must include a minimum of 50% turf grasses as depicted in the Landscape Palette.
- No plants with sharp spines or high toxicity are allowed.

By following these steps, you'll not only conserve water but also save money on your water bill. Many of these practices are already part of your community's landscape maintenance, but every homeowner's effort makes a difference. The future of water conservation starts with you.

- Guests must be accompanied by a resident in good standing. Each household is permitted to bring 8 guests; only 3 guests permitted on Memorial Day, 4th of July, and Labor Day.
- A \$5 guest fee applies

We are transitioning to a cashless payment system this season.

- Cash will be accepted temporarily during May

If you're planning an extended landscaping or yardwork project and will have equipment, materials, or debris temporarily visible in your yard or driveway, please give our Compliance Team a quick heads up at stoneb@ciramail.com or call 214-733-5800.

This helps us notify our inspectors before they begin their community drives and can help avoid unnecessary notices while work is actively underway.

As outlined in the SRCA CC&Rs (Section 9.12), homeowners are responsible for maintaining their property in a "well-maintained, safe, clean and attractive condition at all times," including lawn care, landscaping, pruning, watering, and exterior upkeep.

We know residents work hard to keep their homes and yards looking beautiful, and we appreciate your partnership in helping preserve the appearance of our community.

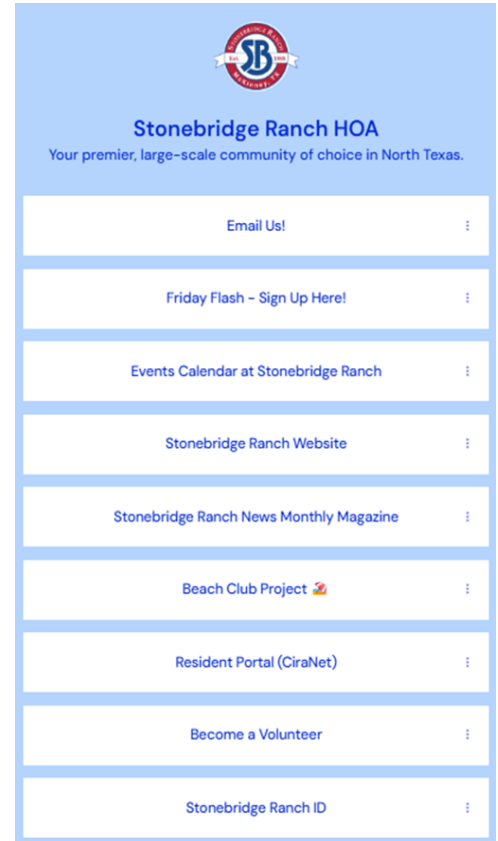
